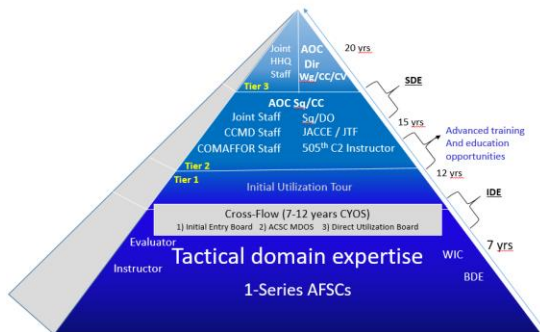


130 Development

Paths to Becoming a 130

1. Initial Skills Training (two selection boards per year): AFPC releases calls for nominations in February and August, boards follow in March and September, and selections are made October and April.
2. Direct Utilization: Board-selected personnel with significant operational-level experience, or IDE Fellowship/Seminar completion (e.g. Joint All-Domain Strategist (JADS) Seminar), who also graduate from 705 TRS's 4-week Command & Control Warrior Advanced Course (C2WAC)

130 Training

The 20-week 130 Initial Skills Training (IST) course produces an officer who is trained at the operational level to effectively identify, plan, integrate, and synchronize Joint All-Domain solutions and effects across the range of military operations, in order to achieve JFC objectives. IST is not designed or intended to produce technical experts of the AOC weapons system.

Block 1: Operational Planning
Block 2: Joint All-Domain Capabilities
Block 3: Integration

** Blocks 2 and 3 are taught at TS/SCI, STO levels*

130 IST Graduates:

1. Effectively apply JPP-A to deliberate & contingency planning problems
2. Effectively lead Operational Planning Teams and Air Planning Groups
3. Effectively integrate and synchronize All-Domain solutions with deliberate & contingency planning events
4. Effectively apply Operational C2 concepts to include understanding joint, service, and coalition command relationships
5. Have skills to apply AFFOR considerations in the execution of deliberate & contingency response plans and execution efforts
6. Have knowledge and skills to understand planning and execution throughout the Joint Air, Space, and Cyber Tasking Cycles
7. Have skills required to plan and integrate IJSTO capabilities
8. Understand the AOC weapons system
9. Effectively communicate plans to senior leaders

Instructor Upgrade Training (IUT):

A 3-week IUT course was created for former IST graduates. The course runs concurrently with IST Block 3, beginning with a week of academics, followed by two weeks of instructing IST students through their capstone exercise. Graduates are awarded a K-Prefix.
