Nurse Transition Program (NTP)

- 10-week training program for new nurses, including 30.5 hours of lecture, discussion and group work and 368 hours of clinical rotations
- Under the supervision of a preceptor, you will gain extensive experience and competence while focusing on team leadership, clinical skills, decision-making and critical thinking.

After completion of NTP, you will be transferred to one of seven permanent duty locations that offer the Nurse Residency Program.

Nurse Residency Program (NRP)

- Designed to support nurses as they continue their successful transition to competent professionals.
- Meets or exceeds the National Council of State Board of Nursing (NCSBN) Transition to Practice Model
- During NRP, your instructors and preceptors will help you focus on four major areas: leadership, quality outcomes, evidence-based practice, and professional role.
- After successful completion of all the NRP objectives, you will be awarded the 46N3 AFSC, signifying you are a fully qualified Air Force Nurse
