

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

**Question:** What kinds of Cadets are competitive for OSI duty?

**Answer:** OSI uses the whole person concept when selecting Cadets for OSI duty. OSI seeks Cadets who are intelligent, hard-working, and display leadership qualities.

Question: What kinds of degrees does OSI look for?

**Answer:** OSI does not have specific degree requirements. While the Tier 1 and Tier 2 degree programs in the AFOCD for OSI include several Criminal Justice, Cyber, and Humanities focused degrees, OSI does not use degree programs as a discriminator when selecting Cadets for OSI duty. OSI seeks Cadets with diverse backgrounds, which includes diverse educational experiences.

**Question:** Are there any specialized skills that set Cadets apart for OSI duty?

**Answer:** Having any prior foreign language or cyber training or experience is helpful, but not required.

**Question:** What can Cadets do to set themselves apart as applicants?

**Answer:** Leadership experience matters, whether it is within their ROTC Detachment, in an internship, or as a volunteer. Also, we encourage Cadets interested in OSI to establish a relationship with their servicing OSI unit and to set up time to shadow members of that unit. This not only gives Cadets a great deal of insight into what OSI life is actually like, but also allows OSI field leaders to better assess and recommend Cadets for OSI duty.
